NEUMANN SOCIETY HOSTS FIRST HUNNOVATORS CONFERENCE

The Neumann Society is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit founded by Hungarian Americans living in Silicon Valley and run by **Dr. George Tilesch**, its President and Chairman of the Board. It is named after John von Neumann, mathematician and a recognized "father" of modern computing.

The organization provides meetings and opportunities for collaboration on innovation, with an emphasis on cooperation among Hungarian innovators and entrepreneurs.

The Neumann Society held its first major event on March 14 in San Francisco at the historic Fort Mason General's Mansion. Prominent speakers included Ambassador Eleni Kounalakis, Stanford Emeritus Professor Philip Zimbardo, Nominee IMF Executive Director Sunil Sabharwal, and Prezi Co-founder and CEO Peter Arvai.
